School Aims:


- To develop a team culture where pupils are encouraged to set goals, lead, work together and support one another;

Fairness - means to treat people equally and reasonably in accordance with our core values and school rules.

Aims and Objectives

Aims of the Policy

Our Promoting Positive Behaviour Policy is designed to:

- reflect our school ethos and aims, and set out how our core values guide the behaviour and actions of those within our school community;
- set out the school code of conduct as agreed by the pupils, teachers, parents and the Board of Governors;
- show how we recognise and reward positive behaviour and the strategies used to address unacceptable behaviour.

Objectives

- To create a happy, safe and caring environment that is both challenging and encouraging.
- To make connections and build positive relationships between staff, pupils and parents.
- To ensure that all members of the school community behave in accordance with our core values.
- To allow staff to promote positive behaviour and reward pupils who show high standards of behaviour.
- Staff to apply the behaviour management strategy fairly and consistently.

This policy places a responsibility on pupils, staff and parents to aspire to high standards of behaviour and achievement. Teachers have a responsibility to model good behaviour and set a good example to students. Parents have a responsibility to support the school ethos and are expected to sign the home/school charter each year.

• School Charter

The school charter was created after a consultation process involving pupils, staff and parents. The charter clearly sets out the rights and responsibilities of the pupils, staff and parents and should be used to guide our interactions and behaviour towards one another. By acting responsibly we can build positive relationships create a climate of respect in which all children can flourish.

Each pupil is given a copy of the school charter at the beginning of each school year. It must be signed by the pupil and a parent/carer and will serve as an agreement to respect the ethos of the school and act responsibly toward others. The Principal will sign the charter on behalf of the staff.

School Rules

Arriving to and leaving school

- > Pupils must be in form class for 8:50 am each morning.
- Once a pupil has been dropped off at school they are not permitted to go to leave school. Pupils are not permitted to walk to the local shops.
- All pupils must enter and leave the school grounds using the front gates. The front door at reception is to be used to enter and exit school. No other door should be used.
- Pupils who arrive to school late must visit the main office to sign in. This is to ensure that the pupil is marked present.
- Pupils who leave school during the school day must get a signed permission slip from their Head of Year and sign out in the main office.
- If pupils have to leave school early they must have provided a note to their Head of Year. The note must state the time and reason for leaving and should be signed and dated by a parent/carer. If a note is not provided the pupil will only be given permission to leave school if collected by a parent/carer from the main office.
- Reasons for absence notes should be provided to the form tutor on the first day back in school.

Safety

- Pupils should walk in an orderly manner around the school. Pupils should walk on the LEFT side of the corridor and stairs.
- > Pupils should line up outside the classroom door until permitted to enter by the teacher.
- Pupils should not be in any **Out of Bounds** area during break and lunch. Out of bounds areas are:
- ✓ Behind the sports hall
- ✓ Behind the music building
- ✓ Stairwells (lunch and Break)
- ✓ Front of school
- ✓ Inside or outside of Technology building
- ✓ Music Corridor
- ✓ Outside school fence

✓ Pupils are permitted to play soccer and basketball in the main playground. The game must be played in the designated area of the playground. Rugby balls are NOT permitted in the school playground.

Health and Hygiene


- Smoking is not permitted in the school grounds or whilst wearing school uniform. The use of electronic cigarettes is not permitted in the school campus. Pupils are not permitted to smoke whilst on school trips or visits.
- > Chewing gum is not permitted in the school grounds.
- Only water is permitted during the school day. Fizzy drinks and energy drinks are not permitted and will be confiscated.
- Toilets should be kept clean and tidy.
- Food should be consumed in the canteen.
- > Litter should be put in the bins provided.
- > Pupils are not permitted to bring hot food into school.

Respect and Personal Responsibility

- > All pupils must wear the uniform correctly.
- > Hair must not be excessively dyed and should only consist of natural colours.
- Pupils are permitted to wear one stud in each ear. Pupils may also wear one small stud in the nose, however, it must be transparent. Rings, hoops, bars and twin piercings to the face or ears are not permitted.
- > Hooded sweatshirts should not be worn to/from school or in the school grounds.
- > Pupils must bring their PE kit to all PE classes.
- Pupils must treat the property of others with care and respect. This includes school buses.
- > Pupils should be mannerly and respectful to each other and staff at all times.

- Pupils can only use mobile phones and other digital devices in class and under teacher supervision. (See Mobile Phones and Digital Devices policy).
- ➢ Foul and abusive language is totally unacceptable.
- > Bullying/ harassment of pupils or staff will not be tolerated.
- > Physical assaults or fights will not be tolerated.
- School Journals must be signed once a week by a parent/carer

Rewards and Celebrating Success



Recognising and acknowledging positive behaviour is central to our approach towards promoting good behaviour and building positive relationships between staff, pupils and the wider school community. Pupils have the opportunity to achieve certificates, badges and positions of responsibility which recognise and reflect the positive contributions they make to school life. We believe that it is essential to set high standards of behaviour and offer pupils incentives and encouragement to help them become the best individuals they can be.

The school's core values (LC6) which were chosen after a comprehensive consultation process involving pupils, teachers, parents and Governors form the foundation on which our school rewards system is built.

Praise/Satisfactory/ Concern

Our school uses a Praise/Satisfactory/Concern system which monitors pupils' behaviour and commitment in class. Praise/Satisfactory/Concern letters are issued 3 times throughout each school year to record exceptionally good, satisfactory or poor behaviour and commitment in class. Pupils are encouraged to achieve as many Praises as they can. Pupils who do particularly well are praised during form class and assembly. Praise letters are sent home with the pupil whilst Concern letters are posted home. All pupils respond to this system enthusiastically and it allows teachers to formally recognise pupils who show a commitment to their studies and the school core values.

Core Value Certificates

Pupils in years 8 and 9 will have the opportunity to achieve a 'Core Value Certificate' and house points each term. If pupils engage fully in their tutorial lessons and demonstrate a commitment to each core value they will be awarded the relevant certificate.

Pupils who do not achieve the certificate at the end of term will have the opportunity to achieve it in the following term. Pupils must achieve all 3 certificates to be presented with the appropriate badge at the end of the school year. Pupils who did not achieve the badge in year 8 can still achieve it in year 9.

School Star Badges

The Bronze, Silver and Gold star system operates in years 8 to 10 and aims to encourage and reward standards of excellence in the following areas: promotion of the school ethos and core values; behaviour; uniform; attendance and homework.

If a pupil maintains the required standard in all of these areas throughout the year, he or she will be awarded the bronze, silver or gold badge. Pupils who are not awarded badges at the end of the school year can still achieve the award in the following school years. The Form Tutor, Head of Year and Assistant Principal will decide which pupils are awarded with the badge based on information provided by class teachers, PSC reports and Lesson Monitor.

Each pupil is also awarded with a certificate and a note of the award is filed in pupil records. The presentation of badges and certificates will be made by the Principal, Assistant Principal (Pastoral), Head of Year and Form Teacher during a special year assembly. Out of school achievements will also be recognised at this event.

Senior School Awards

Aspire Award

In year 11 pupils have the opportunity to achieve the Aspire Award. This award uses the same criteria as the Star Badge Awards and is open to all pupils in year 11, regardless of their previous record. Form tutors and the Head of Year 11 monitor the progress of each child throughout the year and awards are made after consultation with the Assistant Principal (Pastoral). Pupils must demonstrate high aspirations in all aspects of school life to achieve this award and only those who have the award can apply to become a school prefect.

Prefect Award


Prefects are selected in May from pupils in year 11 who have gained the Excellence Award. The pupils are chosen because they are good role models and have proven their commitment to the school and its core values. Prefects serve a 'prefect training' period during May and June. The prefect badges are awarded at the end of June during a special assembly. Prefect badges are awarded by the Head of Year 12, AP, the Vice Principal and Principal.

Senior Leaders

In Year 13 pupils have the opportunity to become Senior Leaders. Pupils must be able to demonstrate an excellent record of commitment to the school ethos and their studies throughout their entire school career. This process will be completed by May of each year.

Head Boy and Head Girl

The pinnacle of our school rewards system is becoming Head Boy or Head Girl. The Head Boy and Head Girl are selected from the Senior Leaders after a process of interviews held by the Principal and Chairperson of the Board of Governors. Senior leaders can also be appointed as deputies to the Head Boy and Head Girl. The pupils who are awarded the positions will hold the post for one year.

Celebrating Success

In school we aim to promote a feeling of positivity and this is reflected in our relationships with students. The school **Award Merit Scheme** is an extension of the PPB policy and affords pupils the opportunity to use certificates and awards gained to apply for a further award and certificate, once they have achieved the necessary criteria. This is detailed in the Awarding and Accreditation policy.
